Honorary Chairs Molly Willis and Ann Carter

Ann Carter and Molly Willis are two treasures who have been instrumental in the growth of the tourism in the Town of Beaufort, and that is why these sisters and longtime residents of Beaufort were chosen as this year's Old Homes Tour Honorary Chairs.

Molly and Ann moved to Beaufort in 1944 as children. Their mother was a teacher at the old St. Paul's School and their father worked at the Duke Marine Lab. For the greater years of their childhood, they lived in a three-story Victorian home that was passed through their mother's side of the family. The home sat on Front Street where the Inlet Inn currently resides.

"My Great Uncle Charles ran the Dey Fish Factory, and he was the one that built the Victorian house on Front Street," Ann said. "When he died, my grandfather got it and my grandmother changed it to apartments during the war, and then we moved back in there. They called it the Dey House."

The two eventually married and moved to separate towns, but eventually returned to Beaufort.

"I came back to visit Mother when I was in Kinston, and it was a totally dead town," Ann said. "In the 1970s, all that changed thanks to an urban renewal grant. The boardwalk and the marina were both built through this project. The town became full of life. A lot of locals did not like it, but to me, it was exciting and inspiring to see."

"At this time Mother, Margaret Arrington, and some other locals were in charge of a design committee to help oversee the plan for the new downtown area. Their work helped the residents see the value of their wonderful old houses and the need for them to be preserved," Ann said. "Through their efforts, the Architectural

Review Committee was started for the town which eventually turned into the Historic Commission."

After Ann moved back to Beaufort, she quickly became immersed in the community and serving the Town as a Commissioner and as Mayor. Ann also has served as a volunteer nurse at the Broad Street Clinic, a member of the Rachel Carson Advisory Group, a Friend of the Maritime Museum, and a member and volunteer of the Beaufort Historical Association. She was the Association's Volunteer of the Year in 1987.

"My sister, Ann, was the one who got me involved with the Beaufort Historic Site," Molly said. "She had been volunteering there for some time leading tours and such. Then I started there, and I can still remember when old Grayden Paul used to do tours on the Double-Decker bus. He would make me jump off the bus and point to the "hanging tree" at the Courthouse where one hanging took place in Beaufort."

Over 30 years later, you can still find Molly dedicating her time to the Beaufort Historic Site, leading site tours and telling the stories of her favorite place, the Old Jail. She volunteered for many years then became a part of the staff.

Molly said her favorite thing about guiding tours are the people. "You get to meet so many people from everywhere, and I like getting to meet people who are from different places and even countries."

"We are honored to have these two sisters so involved over the years," Patricia Suggs said. "From Ann's special caramel cakes to Molly's humor that makes us laugh, we have been truly blessed to have them as part of our Association." ■

Molly (right) said one of their favorite things about growing up in Beaufort was swimming with friends across Taylors Creek and how quaint the community was. "The small town feel of knowing everyone and everyone knowing you... we would go in groups to the beach, swimming and dancing each weekend at the old Teen Club on Pollock Street," she said. The Beaufort Historical Association hosted the semi-annual membership meeting and potluck dinner on January 21 at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Beaufort. Four awards were presented during the evening, recognizing volunteers for their time and dedication. The Beaufort Historical Association honored **Bill Kaeser** with The Edward and Frances Trent Piver Volunteer of the Year Award. Bill Kaeser and his wife, Maria, joined the Association in 2005, and

After the devastation of Hurricane Florence, she spearheaded a new event, the Town Takeover, that would bring the community together and raise spirits. She was fully dedicated to this event, even though she was also dealing with the aftermath of the hurricane. Her Town Takeover was based on her "Peachtree Bluff" book series which is inspired by her hometown of Beaufort, and the event raised significant funds for the BHA.

The final award, the Newcomer Award, was given to **Jacquy Riser** who became a volunteer this past summer. She visited the gift shop eager to get involved with the BHA and almost instantly was volunteering in the Manson House and Jail during Old Homes Tour. Since then she has volunteered for educational programs like Kindergarten Thanksgiving and Harvest Time. She is also a regular volunteer in the Mattie King Davis Art Gallery.
