FEBRUARY & MARCH Featured Artist MATT HIRSHEIMER

e are excited to welcome back artist Matt Hirsheimer this coming February. His show will be held at the gallery in conjunction with the Valentine Membership Party on Sunday, February 4th from 2 – 4 p.m. Hirsheimer will be the featured artist for the months of February and March.

Hirsheimer typically paints with acrylics, and often captures scenes of the Crystal Coast in his work. Before delving full-time into his art, Matt worked as head of safety for Pepsi Beverages Company, where he spent the majority of his professional career. However, he was very drawn to painting and spent his free time creating lively pieces. It even became tradition that every longtime Pepsi Beverages Company employee that retired was (and still is) gifted a reproduction of one of Matt's paintings!

For Hirsheimer, he knew he was always destined to create. "Growing up I always did some form of doodling, cartooning, and creating," he said. "It was in the early 90's that I had an opportunity to study under National Watercolor Society artist, Carol Hubbard. That changed my game as far as my technique. It was like learning a new language!"

"Although watercolor was my style for many years, gravitating to nostalgia and old architecture with a strong attraction to the images Edward Hopper created, I moved into more traditional painting using acrylic as my medium."

Hirsheimer says his favorite piece to date is one that he has created for the upcoming show of the nautrical flags. "My favorite piece, because of the Valentine theme and the fact that I love the acronym BO4T, is the nautical flag piece called simply, I heart BO4T. This ship mast piece with alphabet nautical flags is quite fitting for this historic village nestled behind the Rachel Carson Reserve on the North Carolina coast. Every now and again, all elements of a painting gel into something quite wonderful."

Looking forward to his show, Hirsheimer has quite a few paintings on deck which he says "feature iconic scenes of this beautiful and special town" that also capture his range of styles. The pieces for this show bring to life the picturesque scenes of Beaufort, including the Beaufort picket line fences, Taylor Creek, the restaurants and the unique architecture. "Beaufort is quite the quintessential coastal town with a painting waiting to happen on every corner!" he said.

"My greatest achievements have been to be a part of several great galleries, in particular being part of the artist group at Mattie King Davis Art Gallery. These achievements are anchored by the fact that people enjoy my work enough to bring pieces home to be a part of their personal collections. That is the ultimate achievement!"


A Tribute to Hugh Cullman – A Life Well Lived

Hugh Cullman, a former naval officer and Vice Chairman and Director of Philip Morris Companies, now the Altria Group, died at his home in Pittsboro, North Carolina on November 4. He was 100 years old. This is how his obituary starts, but to those of us who knew him in Beaufort, there was so much more. We knew him after all of his enormous achievements in the high stakes world of the tobacco industry. We knew him as a lover of all things Beaufort, always accompanied by his lovely wife Nan. And it's thanks to Nan, a North Carolinian, that they made their way from New York to Beaufort.

We are so fortunate that they found their way to our small town. He was actually part of the search committee for a new director as a BHA board member when I was hired. He and Nan loved boats and loved travel, so I always enjoyed talking to them about those subjects! They were part of many firsts at the BHA; one of the first weddings on our grounds was for their daughter Alexia, and one of the first "official" Fall Parties was in their home on Front Street.

You can celebrate his life at St. Paul's Episcopal Church on January 10th at 11:30am.

On Saturday, April 13 from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m., The Beaufort Historic Site will kick off the spring season with the annual Publick Day sale on the grounds at 130 Turner Street. The Site will transform into an open-air marketplace, welcoming visitors to explore the vast array of goods and items for sale from various vendors.

"Publick Times" dates back to the Colonial period and is fashioned after Williamsburg of the 1700s when the General Court was in session. "Publick Times" gave visitors an opportunity to come to town to see and be seen, conduct court business, shop, gossip, dine and dance. Guests who attend our modern-day version of Publick Day can expect to find a variety of vendors selling antiques, vintage finds, collectibles, crafts and more.

Vendor space is available to reserve now. Applications are being accepted to rent a 10' x 10' space for \$40 if you are a BHA member and \$60 for non-members. Space is first-come, first serve, and the event is held rain or shine. Spaces are non-refundable. Vendors must supply their own tables and tent if needed. tour schedule. Normally the training takes 12 weeks or more through

a class at the Community College. After ns, Tom Gurganus

looking through all the options, Tom Gurganus and Rick Bennett of the Community College offered special training for our current drivers as well as two new drivers.

Their help was invaluable to say the least. The three drivers, Fritzie Green, Allan Marshall and Walt Wood, were especially grateful to have our other long time drivers, Bill Kaiser, Peter Watts, and Keith Rittmaster, as well as new drivers, Ralph Caricofe and Tom Forrester, added to the bus driver "team".

Tom and Rick literally gave all these drivers personal training so that they could pass the rigorous testing. The written test as well as the bus inspection test prior to driving as well as the driving test all required a great deal of study. Almost all of our VERY SMART drivers had difficulty with at least one of the tests. It's a real testament to their dedication and love of the double decker bus tours that they continued the training.

The Carteret Community College is an incredible asset for our County offering more than 90 associates degrees and other amazing nondegree programs including customized training (like the CDL). We are so thankful for this support, and Tom and Rick said they'd be glad to individually train more volunteers to drive our double-decker bus!
