She loves travel, and she met her husband, Jerry, while traveling in Greece. After living in Wichita, Kansas with her husband for four years, they were desperate to live beside the ocean. They



fell in love with Beaufort immediately and purchased a weekend home. While in Beaufort, she began working with mixed media. When weekend visits to the area were just not enough, she applied to teach in Carteret County

Schools, accepting an art position at Newport Middle School. She quickly transitioned to a full-time resident.

Heather's desire for more independent art led her to opening her own studio in 2013, as she said a "happy place where people can gather for art". And that is what she has done for the last 12 years. Currently Heather's focus is experimenting with Abstract Realism. She is inspired by our Eastern Carolina culture and environment. She also loves to collaborate with other artists, bringing them to Beaufort for frequent workshops.

When asked if she would consider being the Fall Party artist this year, Heather's response was, "Are you serious?? That's been on my bucket list for years!" This is what we love about Beaufort, highlighting our friends and neighbors at the Annual Fall Party!







# n Memory of David Pleace

David Pleace, our foremost double-decker bus expert, passed away peacefully on July 2nd. He is survived by his beloved (and also very British) wife Shirley of 64 years, as well as 3 sons, 6 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. His mind was as great as ever, even at 94 years of age, but his body just would not let him do what he wanted to do. For example, he could sit on the bus and tell the mechanics what was wrong and how to fix things, but he could not do it himself.

David is shown here the day the bus finally arrived from England by ship to Charleston. On May 30th of 2007, David, John Hagle, and Bill Hubbard were driven to Charleston by Grayden Paul to pick up the Route Master bus at the port and drive it back to Beaufort with Grayden serving as the "chase car". David was also the one that found the bus in England and had the roof removed and other alterations done in the UK before it made the trip to Beaufort.

Without David's considerable time and effort, his engineering background, his diligence, and his penchant for doing things right, the Beaufort Historical Association would not have this special bus today.

As many of you know, the bus had a transmission issue last year, followed by a compressor failure this year. Two costly repairs and loss of revenue happened in a row for our beloved bus. Donations are gladly accepted in honor of David to the David Wightman Memorial Bus Fund. David Wightman was the caretaker of our 1948 bus, and after him, David Pleace became the caretaker of our 1967 Bus. So, with the help of two amazing Davids, we've had a vintage English double-decker bus in Beaufort for over 50 years!

Educating current and future generations about Beaufort's historical heritage is one of the most important parts of our mission. Our largest interactive learning experience is Harvest Time open to fourth-grade students. This year the program will run from October 7th through October 17th, 9 a.m. to noon. Students will rotate through hands-on learning stations where volunteers dressed in colonial attire lead students in a wide variety of educational activities. This annual event demonstrates the life of Beaufort families in the 1700s and 1800s through activities such as food preservation, candle making, woodworking, and corn harvesting techniques. Harvest Time is offered free to all Carteret County school students, while out of county schools pay a nominal fee. Due to multiple stations and the two-week duration of this event we are always in need of many volunteers! Please give us a call if you're interested in participating. 

This special Old Burying Ground Tour will take place on Saturday, November 1 in timed groupings at 4:00, 4:30, 5:00 and 5:30 p.m. The tour coincides with Allhallowtide, the three-day period dedicated to remembering the departed. Our tribute will bring to life fascinating tales of those laid to rest in Beaufort's Old Burying Ground. Tickets are \$22 for adults and \$12 for ages 6-12 and available for purchase in the Old Beaufort Shop until sold out.


While the BHA hosts tours of the Old Burying Ground year-round, Voices of the Past offers a unique experience.



Guests will be assigned a Caretaker Guide who will provide safe passage through the ground's winding paths by lantern light. This year the tour will be followed by a Day of the Dead Kachina parade at 6 p.m. beginning at the Old Burying Ground and making its way to Middle Lane for

an additional celebration of ancestors. PLEASE NOTE: This tour, parade, and the Middle Lane event honor the past and are not intended in any way to frighten or evoke fear.

Each tour will last roughly 45 minutes. We can only welcome between 150 to 200 guests, so be sure to reserve your spot by time slot soon.
