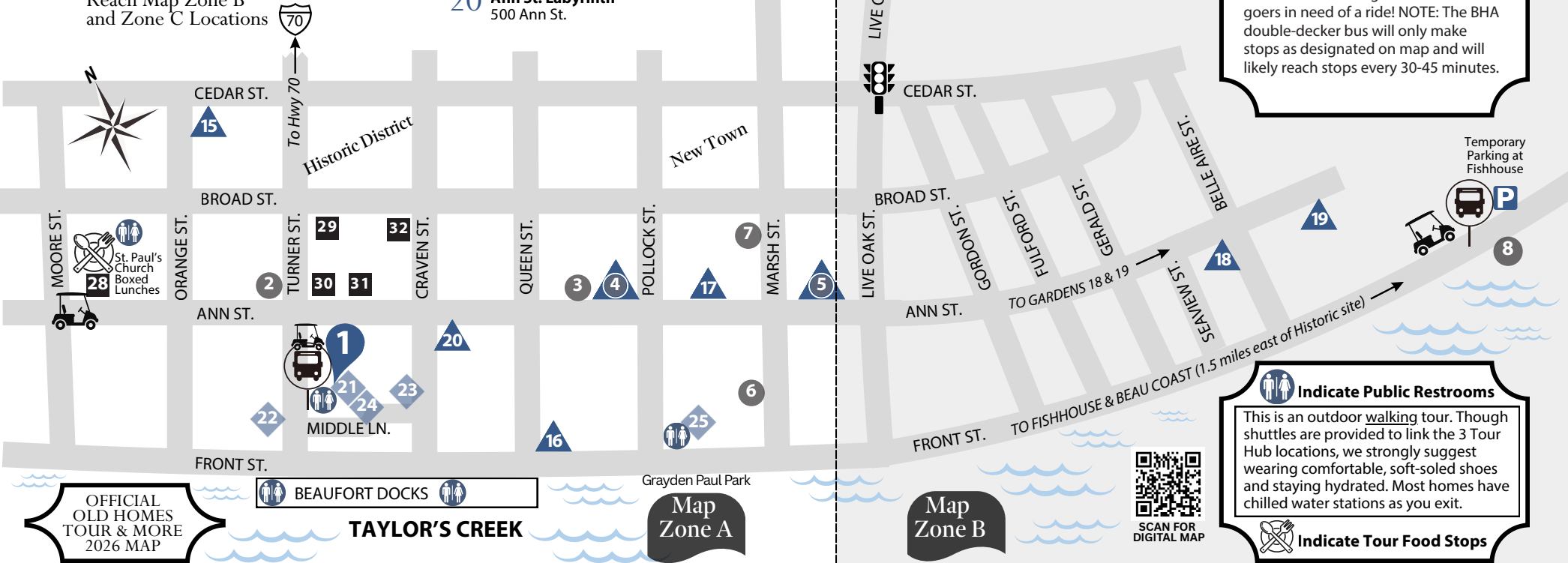

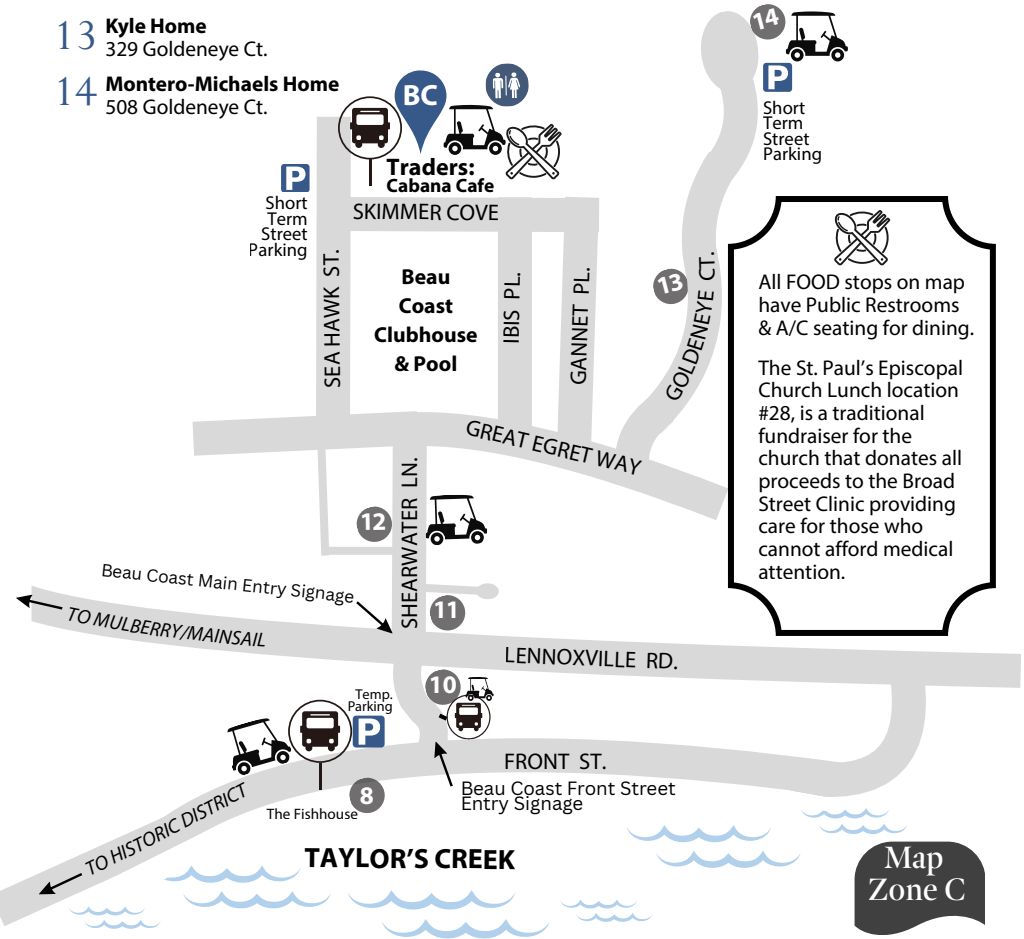

House Descriptions

1. Beaufort Historic Site - 100 Block Turner St.

- **John C. Manson House c. 1825 - 125 Turner St.** - Federal period home with historic decorative faux finishes throughout the house interior. Enjoy its pollinator garden out back as well.
- **Josiah Bell House c. 1825** - On its original foundation, furnished to reflect the Victorian period and lifestyle. Popular Victorian sensibilities extend to the maze garden to the left of the home.
- **Leffers Cottage c. 1778** - A typical waterfront cottage moved from Front Street. The small kitchen garden to its right is maintained by the Carteret County Extension NC Master Gardeners.
- **Carteret County Courthouse c. 1796** - Award-winning, authentic restoration of the oldest wood-frame courthouse in North Carolina.
- **Old Jail c. 1829** - Historic jail used until 1954. Contains jail cells, the jail keeper's quarters, a noose, and a pillory.
- **Apothecary Shop & Doctor's Office c. 1859** - Unique collection of equipment used by the county's first pharmacists, doctors, and dentists.
- **Rustell House c. 1723** - The oldest structure on the Historic Site is home to the Mattie King Davis Art Gallery, Carteret County's oldest art gallery. Current Featured Artist: Nicole White Kennedy.

2. Durham Home/Chadwick House c. 1910 - 315 Ann St. - PLAQUED: New owners of the 2-story Queen Anne-Colonial Revival home with elegant wraparound porch and Doric columns have just completed a full restoration of the property inside and out. Visit to learn of its very storied history.

3. John Benners Jones House c. 1898 - 607 Ann St. - PLAQUED: Side-gabled house with molded eaves and interior chimney. A hipped porch with boxed posts represents the architecture of its era and region.

4. Mace House c. 1832 - 619 Ann St. - PLAQUED: One of 8 houses chosen for the NC State Dept. of Archives and History as an exhibit display sample of Federal Architecture in the NC Museum of History.

5. Richard Whitehurst House c. 1881 - 809 Ann St. - PLAQUED: The stately, 2-story Foursquare house with hipped-roof and central gabled dormer, lovingly restored by current owners, exudes an Americana charm. The gardens are a delightful retreat under mature trees that shade this block of Ann St.

6. Thompson Home - 107 Marsh St. - A charming, full-width porch welcomes guests. High ceilings, beautiful hued interior spaces, and stunning artwork complement this doctor's office-turned-dwelling.

7. B. Jones House c. 1875 - 213 Marsh St. - PLAQUED: This hipped-roof cottage with inviting portico porch and manicured landscaping exemplifies how Beaufort history can blend with modern living.

8. The Fishhouse - 2111 Front St. - Literally perched over the edge of Taylor's Creek, the c1940s Fishhouse offers a true glimpse into Beaufort's working waterman's past. A must see stop on the tour.

9. Thompson Home - 142 Shearwater Ln. - A beautiful Beau Coast residence, where coastal-inspired design and comfortable living come together in one of Beaufort's most popular waterfront communities.

10. Atkins Home - 2203 Lennoxville Rd. - Named, "Beau Cottage" the homeowner built the home in 2018 and loving calls her style "shipwreck"; items that would have washed ashore mainly from English ships. Take a peek, it's designed for fun, age-in-place, easy coastal living.

11. McGee Home - 227 Shearwater Ln. - Built in 2017, this was one of the first homes built in Beau Coast and was the original model home. It has been upgraded significantly by the McGee's.

12. Kyle Home - 329 Goldeneye Ct. - After falling in love with Beaufort's coastal charm, Jim and Edwina Kyle chose Beau Coast as their retreat by the sea. Purchased before construction was completed, the home reflects their personal touches and showcases artwork by local and regional artists.

13. Montero-Michaels Home - 508 Goldeneye Ct. - A unique home plan to the community, it backs up to a natural greenspace with landscaping designed and tended to by the owners. The home is filled with artifacts collected along their frequent travels, domestic and international.

14. 805 Mulberry - Following a fire, this school house was built at the Mulberry St. location in 1946. It later became Beaufort High, then Beaufort Elementary. Recently converted into a residential condominium community, the three sample homes on tour showcase loft style, coastal home living.

Art & Design Descriptions

21. Mattie King Davis Art Gallery - 130 Turner St.

Located in the historic Rustell House c.1723 view Old Homes Tour Featured Artist, Nicole White Kennedy's showing along with over 150 additional pieces of art by local and regional NC artists.

22. Beaufort Home Shoppe - 113 Turner St.

Under new ownership and just across Turner St. from the historic site, the shop is brimming with unique home goods, home furnishings, and lovely artwork.

23. Craving Art Studio - 121 Craven St.

Owner, Heather Sink, will have her original oil paintings on display with other artists; Miriam Sutton (Local Photography), Rachel Croom (Fine Jewelry), and Nana Bees Glass (Functional & Whimsical Gifts).

24. "The Atelier" Cope & Co. - 125 Craven St.

The charming workshop where Danielle Vollnogle makes her artisan quality leather goods.

25. Town of Beaufort Murals c. 1940 - 701 Front St. Inside Town Hall

Treasured murals by Simka Simkhovitch commissioned under The New Deal Arts Program in 1939.

26. Feather Your Nest Beaufort - 208 Campen Rd.

Well worth the short drive. Visit the welcoming gallery and working studio for one of a kind wall art or functional wooden pieces for the home. The owner is also a landscape designer. There is much to see.

27. Ernest Flowers & Design - 801 Mulberry St.

This shop is much more than beautiful flowers. One notable find is its amazing selection of wine and bubbles. Stop in and discover this hidden gem.

Historic Places Descriptions

28. St. Paul's Episcopal Church c.1857 - 215 Ann St. - Built by local shipbuilders, this church contains original stained glass windows. *[Delicious homemade Box Lunches available here during lunch hours](#)

29. Beaufort by the Sea Community Church - 215 Turner St. - Founded in February of 2023, the building was originally constructed as the Beaufort Free Will Baptist Church in 1907.

30. First Baptist Church c. 1854 - 403 Ann St. - Established in April 1851, this church has evolved over decades including the completion of a new parsonage in the early 1970s.

31. Old Burying Ground c. 1709 - 400 Block Ann St. - Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, explore Beaufort's storied past as our tour guides highlight self-guided strolls through this historic site.

32. Purvis Chapel c. 1820 - 215 Craven St. - [Beaufort's oldest church](#) in continuous use and an important landmark for Beaufort's religious and cultural heritage.

33. The Mainsail "The Old Gym" - 805 Mulberry - Constructed in 1935 as a WPA program project the old gym has been reimaged as a premiere event center, currently hosting the Seadogs Tribute Exhibit.

Garden Descriptions

15. Calypso Cottage Garden - 324 Orange St. - This cute, pergola covered backyard garden is an unexpected surprise as whimsical as the shop located in the bright yellow, island-style cottage.

16. Inlet Inn Lookout Lounge and Courtyard - 601 Ann St. - The Inn boasts a lovely native plant garden around its signage on Front St., a manicured courtyard off the lobby, and the 3rd floor Lookout Lounge (elevator access) offers a view of Taylor's Creek and the Beaufort Docks that can't be beat. Come by!

17. Ann Street Inn - 707 Ann St. - A recent renovation to the Inn by new owners Alura Acosta and Sam Roche, the courtyard garden is perfect for casual entertaining or small, formal events.

5. Radford Garden - 809 Ann St. - Enjoy this gorgeous oasis perfect for backyard entertaining.

18. La Mer Est Belle - 107 Belle Aire St. - This enchanting coastal themed garden has to be visited to be believed. Situated on a corner of the less traveled end of Ann St. it has been recently transformed by owner, Tiffany Glisson, into a jaw-dropping landscaped world of art and nature, sea and land.

19. Cawman Garden - 1522 Ann St. - This is novelty "Train Garden" was created by owners Doug and Heidi Cawman for the Old Homes Tour. The miniature town with its working train is a delight for guests.

20. Ann Street Methodist Church Labyrinth - 500 Ann St. - (The actual church is closed both OHT days for weddings this year, but please enjoy the labyrinth walk)
